

## Quinoa

**1** What is South America's most famous product? Footballers, of course! Names like Neymar, Messi, and Suárez are recognized around the world. Today, however, a different product is taking the world by storm.

**2** Quinoa (pronounced KEEN-wa) is a plant in the amaranth family. It grows up to 2.0 meters, with small red seeds at the top. The quinoa plant is farmed for these seeds, which are also called quinoa. Quinoa seeds are a grain, like rice, wheat, and corn. They are small and round—and very healthy. Uncooked quinoa is about 64% carbohydrates and a surprising 14% protein. It is also rich in vitamins and gluten-free.

**3** Quinoa was first grown deep in the Andes Mountains, not far from Lake Titicaca in modern-day Peru, by the ancient Inca people. The Incas believed quinoa was the food of the gods. They called it *chisaya mama*, or 'mother of grains'. Traditionally, the Incan emperor planted the first quinoa seeds in spring using gold tools, and for centuries it was the Incas' most important food. When the Spanish conquered that part of South America, they called quinoa 'poor people's food'. In fact, in the 16<sup>th</sup> century quinoa was banned, and the local people were made to **cultivate** wheat. However, quinoa grew in the wild, and when Peru became a country in 1821 quinoa was ready to make a comeback. Peruvians began farming quinoa again.



4 In the 1980s, farmers in the state of Colorado in the United States began to farm quinoa. Colorado is a mountainous state, and its cool, dry climate is similar to the climate in the Andes Mountains. About the same time, Americans were moving away from cheap junk food toward new, healthier foods. Quinoa became more and more popular. By the end of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, the United States was importing about half a million kilograms of quinoa from South America. Last year, imports were at 42.1 million kilograms. People pay a lot for quinoa, too—about \$4 per kilograms. (Rice, meanwhile, costs about \$0.50 per

kilograms.) It is also becoming popular in traditionally rice-loving countries like Japan. Many restaurants serve quinoa dishes, like Biryani Pot's quinoa biryani. (It's very good, by the way.)

**5** The quinoa craze is a good thing in many ways. However, it has had some harmful side effects. Yes, quinoa is helping to grow the Peruvian economy, bringing in \$57.2 million last year. But the high prices are hitting Peru, too. Poor Peruvians who can't afford quinoa are turning to the same cheap junk food that the rest of the world is abandoning. This is leading to health problems. So think twice before you buy that box of quinoa. It's costing somebody else more than you might think.
